



Spring 2022 On-Site Guidelines for Chairs & Schools

All spring 2022 continental U.S. accreditation visits have the option to host the Chair on-site for the one-day Chair visit and the full three-day team visit. Schools and Chairs must agree on the chair going on site. **When circumstances allow and the school and Chair agree, the rest of the team can also have the option to join on-site for the final day of the visit.** The following guidelines should be kept in mind for schools and Chairs when considering these options:

Governmental	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Governmental regulations permit external visitors to enter the county/city/town and to work on-site at the institution.
Institution	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Institutional policies permit visitors to be on campus.The proposed activity or event is approved by the institution in advance, in full alignment with its published policy for all visitors.
Chair	<ul style="list-style-type: none">The Chair can freely travel to, enter, and return home from the institution with no quarantine requirement.Only a Chair that has been fully vaccinated will be eligible to conduct on-site work.The Chair is willing and agrees that it is safe to be on site, based on the information available from the institution and from local authorities regarding use of masks, social distancing, health requirements, and other areas of potential concern.The Chair follows all required governmental/state/provincial protocols in terms of travel and conduct during the activity/event.
Team Members	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Both the school and the Chair must both agree that it is acceptable and safe for the rest of the team to attend on-site for the final day of the visit.If it is permitted, each individual team member may opt to attend on-site for the final day <u>or</u> continue to participate virtually. Team members will not be required to be on-site at any point.If they choose to be on-site, all team members must follow the same guidelines as the Chair (above), including compliance with school requirements and vaccination status.
